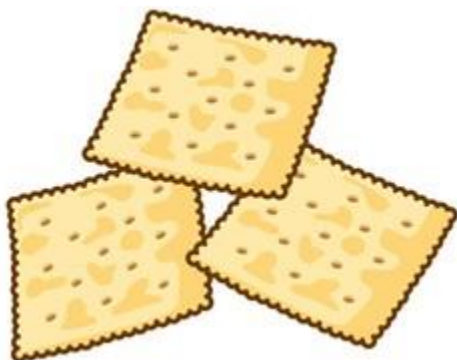


Deacons Serve With Open Hearts and Helping Hands

Osceola's Sunday School classes learned more about Advent and the birth of our Savior throughout December. The classes prepared Christmas ornaments to be included in the December Food Pantry's boxes and held a "birthday party" for Jesus as we finished out our year's activities.

No classes were held on December 28th or January 4th but will resume January 11th. Lessons will span from Epiphany, complete our study of Old Testament figures who served God by serving others, and then focus on the beginning of Jesus's ministry.

The Sunday School classes will be sponsoring a "Noise Offering" during worship on Sunday, February 8th. This "Super Bowl" event will be a "Super Fruit Bowl" as the students will collect canned fruit for Osceola Food Pantry in addition to the loose change offering. The recipient of the monetary offering will be chosen by the students soon and announced to the congregation.

Youth Group Christmas Fun

As we prepared for Christmas, our youth made special treat bowls and homemade Christmas cards to be included in the December food boxes for Osceola Food Pantry. Of course, all the candy was checked out for quality purposes!

The Youth Group's annual Christmas Mystery Event was back on the road this year as the youth were divided into teams, solved clues to determine destinations, and visited various sites in and around Clark. Their stops allowed them to sing Christmas carols to church members and others to obtain "nutritional fortification." We also caroled over the phone to some members who live a little farther away. The evening always ends with a stop to a Nativity scene where a prayer is offered along with singing "O Come All Ye Faithful." It's a wonderful chance to remind us of the "reason for the season" as we have fun spreading some holiday joy!

The Youth Group plans to kick off 2026 with a post-Christmas party at the Dietze's that will include lots of games, snacks and a winter dip in the hot tub! We're also looking forward to a Lock-in sometime in February. Everyone is looking forward to an exciting (and exhausting) night!



Food Pantry Update
