Dear Friends:

The first Sunday in October is designated as World Communion Sunday, which celebrates our oneness in Christ with all our brothers and sisters around the world. The apostle Paul tells us that we are to "discern the body" when we partake of Holy Communion, mindful that we note our relationship to all our brothers and sisters in Christ in the celebration.

World Communion Sunday (originally called Worldwide Communion Sunday) is a gift of the Presbyterian Church to the larger ecumenical church. The first celebration occurred at Shadyside Presbyterian Church in Pittsburgh, PA, in 1933 where Dr. Hugh Thompson Kerr served as pastor.

"The concept spread very slowly at the start. People did not give it a whole lot of thought. It was during the Second World War that the spirit caught hold, because we were trying to hold the world together. Worldwide Communion symbolized the effort to hold things together, in a spiritual sense. It emphasized that we are one in the Spirit and the Gospel of Jesus Christ."

Today, World Communion Sunday is celebrated around the world, demonstrating that the church founded on Jesus Christ peacefully shares God-given goods in a world increasingly destabilized by globalization and global market economies based on greed. The Peacemaking Offering, established in 1980, is set in the context of World Communion Sunday to celebrate our common life in the global bonds of Christ's peace-giving body.

As we receive the bread and cup, we celebrate Christ, our Peace, and are renewed to pass Christ's peace to those around us and across the world. On World Communion Sunday, October 5th, as we come to the table of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, may we renew our commitment to the work of peace as followers of Christ, our Peace, who shows us the way to live as peacemakers in our world.

So it is fitting that we gather to Rise Against Hunger on World Communion Sunday. If people go hunger or have no roof over their heads, there can be no peace. On Sunday, October 6th, we gather after worship in Fellowship Hall to make meals to help feed the world's hungry. We need as many hands (and feet) as possible that day to make over 10,000 meals. Come and be part of this experience. Come and be part of Christ's call to feed the hungry. Together we Rise Against Hunger.

It's not just a pantry staple, it's also the key ingredient we'll be working with during our Rise Against Hunger event on Sunday, October 5, where we pack meals to help fight hunger one grain at a time.



Operation Christmas Child

The Sunday School children will be filling shoe boxes once again to send to children around the world, spreading some joy and the Gospel. The boxes must be delivered in mid-November to our collection site so we will begin collecting items (and boxes) now and the children will be packing boxes by early November.



Below is a list of items that we collect and a list of items not to include. You may purchase and donate any of these items and bring them to in-person worship or contact Alice Dietze (adietze@verizon.net or 732-574-8956) to have the items picked up. To make it even easier, you may instead make a monetary donation in either of these two ways:

- Write a check for \$10 per box to cover shipping made payable to "Samaritan's Purse" with "Operation Christmas Child" on the memo line and place it in the offering plate or mail to the church
- Write a check to "Osceola Presbyterian Church" with "Shoebox items" on the memo line to be used to purchase items to fill the shoeboxes. Checks may be placed in the offering plate or given to Alice Dietze. We have shoppers ready!

ITEMS NEEDED:

- EMPTY SHOEBOXES!!!!!!!
- Small toys (balls, stuffed animals, dolls, cars, puzzles, etc.)
- School supplies (we have already received generous donations of school supplies, but these are the items most requested)
- Hygiene items (toothbrushes, combs, washcloths, hair accessories)
- Small clothing items (socks, gloves or mittens, hats, scarves, tee shirts, flip-flops)
- Useful items for older children (sewing kits, fishing supplies, small tools, flashlights and batteries)

DO NOT INCLUDE:

- Liquids or lotions
- Food items or candy
- Toothpaste or soap
- War-related items (toy guns, military figures, knives)
- Breakable items
- Aerosol cans

Celebrating 10 Years of Service





September was an exciting month for Osceola Food Pantry! We celebrated the 10th anniversary of our expanded program on Sunday, September 21, 2025. It all began with a very special worship service when we praised God for his grace in supporting our food ministry.

Following worship, a Luncheon Program was held in Fellowship Hall. Our Youth Group prepared a baked ziti lunch and numerous volunteers prepared special dishes that were from recipes given out to our Food Pantry families over the past ten years. The program included a slide show depicting the

accomplishments of our program and we revealed some amazing new totals. In the past year alone, the Food Pantry distributed a new record of 13,469 pounds as well as giving \$1,640 in gift cards. Even greater than that, our ten-year total is now 114,443 pounds of food and \$19,460 in gift cards! Praise God!!

Our Luncheon Program gave us an opportunity to recognize numerous community groups and individuals who have supported our Food Pantry. We also made sure to show our appreciation to our congregation for their amazing support and to some special "golden" volunteers. Our Food Pantry families shared in the celebration as they received "party treats" (including ice cream, cake, soda, popcorn, pretzels, and brownie mix) in their September special bags. All the success of the past ten years has truly been, with God's help, a church-wide effort! Well done, good and faithful servants!
